| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Buckets</p> <p>Buckets are the most common mosquito habitats found at homes. Empty buckets and turn them over at least once per week.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Rain Barrels</p> <p>Rain barrels conserve water but can also be a perfect home for mosquito larva. Cover the tops of rain barrels with tightly fitted screen. Plug the overflow hole to prevent mosquitoes from getting in.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Garbage Cans & Recycling Bins</p> <p>Garbage cans, recycling bins, and recycled containers can hold water. We recommend you drill drainage holes in the bottoms and keep covered. Dispose of contents weekly.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Bird Baths</p> <p>Change water at least once per week in bird baths.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Tarps, Plastic Bags & Sheets</p> <p>When tarps are not fitted tightly, multiple pockets form and collect water. Keep tarps tight and refit them when water collects.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Ornamental Ponds</p> <p>Ornamental ponds without fish are great homes for mosquitoes. Get fish and the fish will eat the mosquito larvae.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Gutters</p> <p>Gutters hold water when clogged with leaves or improperly pitched. Plus leaf debris holds food for larvae. Keep gutters clean and properly pitched. Improper pitch and ridges cause these pipes to hold water. Pitch downspout extensions so water drains completely after it rains.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Behind the Shed & Under the Shrubs</p> <p>Look under bushes and in overlooked spots in the yard and remove debris that can hold water.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Flexible Downspout Extensions</p> <p>We recommend a non-flexible extension because the ridges can hold water.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Portable Basketball Hoops</p> <p>The fill holes in the base of portable basketball hoops allow mosquitoes to reach the water and lay eggs. Make sure caps for fill holes are in place.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Leaky Hose Spigots</p> <p>Water can accumulate below the faucet. Fix the leak or call a plumber to repair.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Kiddie Pools</p> <p>Empty or change water in kiddie pools every 5-7 days. Store indoors or turn over when not in use.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Decks & Porches</p> <p>Make sure to check under decks and porches for containers that may hold water.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Sand Boxes</p> <p>Water accumulates in some plastic sand boxes whether covered or not. Drill small drainage holes in the bottom of your sand box.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Planter Saucers</p> <p>Plant saucers hold water and can support mosquito larva. Dump the water out every 3-5 days or don't use a saucer at all.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Big Plastic Toys, Wagons, Etc.</p> <p>Wagons, dump trucks, cars, kitchen sets, and playhouses all fill with rain water when left outside. Keep toys turned over or inside when not in use. If water can get inside a toy, so can a mosquito. Drill holes to allow water to escape.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Planters Without Drainage Holes</p> <p>Planters fill with water after heavy rains or heavy watering. Drill holes at the bottom to prevent water from collecting.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Deflated Toys</p> <p>Like a tarp, a deflated toy will create multiple small pockets that fill with water and provide habitat for larvae. Drain off water, dry out and store indoors when not in use.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Self-Watering Planters</p> <p>Mosquitoes can get in the hole you fill with water. Tightly seal the hole after adding water or do not use these planters at all.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Boats</p> <p>There are many compartments on a boat that can collect water. Even when a boat itself doesn't hold water, there can be containers left on a boat that do. Empty all the water possible. Check regularly.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Wheelbarrows</p> <p>Water can collect in the main tub or small crevices. Turn wheelbarrows over, and check weekly for water collection or store them inside.</p> | <p><input type="checkbox"/> Pools/Pool Covers</p> <p>Pool covers and pool skimmer compartments filled with water will breed mosquitoes. Treat the pool or pool cover in the spring before you open it.</p> |
| <p><input type="checkbox"/> Watering Cans</p> <p>Watering cans can collect water. Store the watering can inside or keep upside down.</p> | |
